Explanation of decision:

The proposal raises a number of preliminary key environmental factors. The proponent has generally provided adequate referral information about the proposal, the potential impacts, and proposed management measures to enable the EPA to undertake its assessment, however some additional information is required relating to Air Quality, Terrestrial Environmental Quality, and Flora and Vegetation. There were no comments on the referral indicating limited public concern.
