Decision: s. 39A – Not Assess

Referral Examined, preliminary investigations and inquiries conducted. Proposal not to be assessed under Part IV of the EP Act – Advice given.

Explanation of decision:

The EPA considers that the likely environmental effects of the proposal are not so significant as to warrant formal assessment due to historic disturbance for agricultural purposes at the proposed site; and the extent and consequence of the predicted impacts as a result of the proposal, are predicted to be of a small scale.

The EPA is of the view that the potential impacts of the proposal can be adequately managed through implementation of the proposal in accordance with the referral documentation, the proponent's management and mitigation measures and associated legislation.

The EPA considers that emissions such as dust and potential impacts from clearing activities can be adequately regulated through other statutory processes including Part V Division 1 (Clearing of Native Vegetation) and Division 2 (Works approval and licence) of the *Environmental Protection Act 1986*, and the Extractive Industry Licence administered under the *Planning and Development Act 2005*.

Appeals:

This decision is appealable. Appeals close 30-03-2020. Appeals are administered by the Office of the Appeals Convenor.
