**Subject: Perdaman Urea Project - Project Destiny**

I am writing to you on behalf of the Murujuga Aboriginal Corporation (MAC) and its board members with regard to the Perdaman Urea Project, Project Destiny (the Project). I am aware the Project has completed the initial Environmental Scoping Document (ESD) public review period and has now submitted the draft Environmental Review Document to the EPA.

MAC has completed the heritage surveys over both Sites C and F of the Burrup Strategic Industrial Area (BSIA) for the Department of Jobs, Tourism, Science and Innovation (JTSI). We note that whilst Sites C and F have been partially disturbed by previous activity on the BSIA, Perdaman have made extensive efforts to preserve cultural sites on Murujuga land having made a firm commitment to ensure that the significant 'Fish Thalu' site on Site F will be protected, with full access rights being granted to the Traditional Custodians.

Perdaman and its Project Team has been diligent in keeping myself and the Board fully briefed and up-to-date on the progress of the Project. A recent Project update and environmental briefing held at our Burrup office (Monday, 14 October 2019) provided another example of Perdaman's collaborative approach in developing the Project on Murujuga land. In addition to the briefing held in October, Perdaman and its Project team have provided several previous briefing sessions in February, June and also in August.

MAC is looking forward to reviewing Perdaman's ERD during the public review period. Perdaman Chairman Vikas Rambal and the Perdaman Project team have offered to undertake extensive community engagement workshops in Karratha, Roebourne and Dampier during this period as part of its stakeholder engagement plan. We intend to support Perdaman at these workshops.

With regard to the above matters, MAC is supportive of Project Destiny and the EIA process which will ensure the Project is developed in a responsible manner.
