REF: Non-objection letter provided by the Puutu Kunti Kurrama and Pinikura Heritage Subcommittee concerning Fortescue Metals Groups' S18_104 Western Hub – Phase 3 section 18 application

Yamatji Marlpa Aboriginal Corporation (YMAC) is providing a non-objection letter on behalf of the Puutu Kunti Kurrama and Pinikura (PKKP) Heritage Subcommittee (HSC) regarding Fortescue Metals Groups (Fortescue) Phase 3 Section 18 notice at the Eliwana Western Hub project area.

The initial section 18 notification was provided to the HSC via YMAC on 23 August 2018. The draft section 18 application was then provided to YMAC on 14 September 2018. YMAC and the HSC attended an on country s18 ethnographic consultation and HSC meeting with Fortescue on 29 September to 01 October 2018.

The HSC met on-country at Eliwana on 01 October 2018. The S18_104 Western Hub — Phase 3 section 18 was discussed in detail at this meeting. The HSC members advised that the following conditions should accompany the non-objection of the section 18. Please note, for all of the partially impacted places (PUU17-015, PUU18-015, and PUU18-008) it is PKKP's understanding that Fortescue have committed to collaborative, ongoing management and monitoring of the extant portions of these sites with the PKKP Traditional Owners. The specifics of which will be worked out at a later time via the appropriate channels.

- PUU17-015 Fortescue has committed to only impact the portion of the site
 within the land and fund and facilitate the relocation of salvaged material to a
 keeping place in the excised portion of the place.
- PUU18-015 Fortescue have committed to only impact the southern portion of the site. The northern section, containing the majority of the significant heritage values will remain intact and Fortescue have committed to fund and facilitate the relocation of salvaged material to a keeping place in the excised portion of the place.
- PUU18-115 and PUU17-030 Fortescue have committed to fund and facilitate
 an archaeological salvage of these places It is proposed that this salvage will be
 undertaken with younger PKKP Traditional Owners (18 and over) to facilitate
 intergenerational knowledge transfer and to begin training a new generation
 PKKP heritage consultants.
- PUU18-041 PUU18-095 Fortescue have agreed in principal to support a
 PKKP videography project to make a short video about the cultural landscape
 prior to the disturbance of these places. PKKP have agreed to develop a clear
 plan for the video for Fortescue's consideration and to ensure the field
 component is completed in consideration of Fortescues Project timeframes.
- PUU18-008 Fortescue have agreed to excise the portion of the place that is not required from the Land.
