In Confidence; Proposed Downstream Processing Chemical Production Facility

Thank you for your time meeting with myself and proponent representatives recently.

I refer to your letter dated 26 July 2018 advising Coogee Chemicals that a third party has referred this proposal to the EPA.

Thank for your letter and for raising the external referral and associated requirements. As the lead proponent, Wesfarmers Chemicals, Energy and Fertilises acknowledges receipt of the letter, and the intention of the EPA to set the project's level of assessment.

The project partners are currently at pre-feasibility stage for the proposed project and have recently signed an Option to Lease with the State Government in a major industrial estate on the Burrup Peninsular.

Early phase discussions have been initiated with a number of stakeholders including potential gas suppliers, relevant government departments as well as community groups including the local Murujuga Aboriginal Corporation. The ongoing consultation with all stakeholders will be an essential part of each progressive stage of the project.

While the project is at pre-feasibility, we have prepared the EPA's Template for defining the key characteristics of a proposal to the extent possible (attached). We trust the early description of information provided meets your requirements.

Should the pre-feasibility continue to be favourable, then a full feasibility study including rigorous technical, commercial and environmental due diligence processes will be undertaken. We expect refinement of the key characteristics proposed will continue during these subsequent activities.

The proponents are committed to ensuring a sustainable future and this extends to the proposed project and concerns relating to its development. We understand the value of safe and sustainable development, and in all respects we will continue to work in consideration of important issues of environmental and cultural significance in areas such as the Burrup.
